
2023 Envelopes Boxes

Independence...a concept that we in America hold dear. We celebrate it every year on July 4. But like any good thing, independence can be taken too far. When we become so invested in not needing to depend on anyone else for livelihood, subsistence, influence - when we are determined to be self-sufficient, unconnected, separate – we can also become too distant, too untethered. All the words I used here (not depending on anyone for livelihood, subsistence, influence, being self-sufficient and unconnected and separate) are different definitions and ways of explaining independence. Of course, being free from a tyrannical authority and being able to make fundamental decisions for ourselves is a good thing. But our original guest for **PASTOR** independence in this country was focused not on each individual, but on all the people currently living in our country together. We sought independence TOGETHER. We wanted to make the decisions that were in the best interest of all of us living together in this country, not

have those decisions made for us by someone else who wasn't experiencing what we experienced. Our United Church of Christ operates in similar ways. Each church is its own autonomous congregation, while still being in covenant with all the other churches in the United Church of Christ. So our visioning, our goal setting, our financial decisions all include discerning not only what is best for us at St. John's but also how our decisions affect the other churches and their members in our Association. Our decisions are made taking into consideration the needs of the Heartland Conference and our National setting. And, as followers of Christ, called to love our neighbors as ourselves, all our decisions are made thinking about the effects on all people in the world. Independence is a wonderful thing. Especially when it's accomplished in covenant with our neighbors.

Happy Anniversary St. John's July 18, 1841 Celebrating 182 Years

"Welcome Home, Welcome Home to St. John's'

L.H. Lammers Memorial Fund Sunday July 30, 2023

Rev. Louis H. Lammers was pastor of St. John's Church from 1922 until his sudden death in 1960. He married his wife, Bertha, shortly after graduating from Eden Theological Seminary and shortly before beginning his pastorate here. They had 4 children who grew up in St. John's and Newark. Today 2 of his grand-daughters, Mrs. Laurie Homrighouse, and Mrs. Cristi Hunkler are members of St. John's.


Rev. Lammers was much loved by this congregation and by this community. The church grew so much during his pastorate, a move to this brand new sanctuary was necessary in 1957. More fellowship groups were formed, new ways of reaching out to the surrounding community were performed, a son of the congregation was in seminary preparing for ordination.

Rev. Lammers died unexpectedly the day after returning from vacation. The congregation and the town were in shock. He was the beloved shepherd of St. John's. He was the dean of pastors in Newark.

To remember Louie Lammers, the Church Council voted the following June, 1961, to establish the L.H. Lammers Memorial Fund to be able to provide scholarship money for students from this congregation studying for full time Christian ministry. The rules of the fund state that the loose offering on the last Sunday in July, would be put into the fund for this purpose. And every year since then, St. John's has collected this offering.

This year, July 30, is designated as the L.H. Lammers Memorial Fund Sunday. Again, all loose offering (coin and currency not in an envelope) will be placed in that special fund. Anyone wanting to make a donation by check should clearly mark the check on the memo line with LAMMERS FUND, or have that on the envelope.

We hope to have Laurie Homrighouse and Cristi Hunkler with us on Sunday, July 23, to talk about their memories of their Grandpa and his work at St. John's. Please plan to be with us both July 23, and July 30, as we remember this great man in the history of St. John's.

Only God has the power to save.

But in our human zeal, we sometimes forget that. We like to make plans, draw diagrams, rally the troops, and take the hill. And we fail to remember that "unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain" (Psalm 127:1a).

We need to partner with God in this work of evangelism so that our labor is not fruitless or futile. So how do we access

that building power that the psalmist speaks of?

We ask Him for it. Prayer is where we start.

→ Ask God to help you identify 5 people for whom you can begin to pray. We have put together a list of biblical prayers to help guide your prayer times for your 5. Download it here at gomvmt.us/wp-content/uploads/2023/04/my5.pdf .

There is more to developing a consistent prayer life than loving God; there are practical matters. Here are two things to help you grow in prayer throughout the month of May (and beyond):

1. Set a schedule for regular prayer times.

There are many demands on our time so we must be intentional. If we do not set our schedules ourselves, others will set them for us, and the result will be very little time for prayer.

2. Make a prayer list.

Write out your prayer list (using our quick prayer card, for example) and use it during your prayer times. We will pray more often and with greater focus if we develop prayer lists and bring them to our prayer times.

Jesus is our example. He did not permit ministry to others to hinder His prayer life, nor did He allow His prayer life to hinder His ministry to others. Even after He had ministered long hours in preaching and healing the sick, He still departed to a solitary place to pray—to commune with His Father and be strengthened.

If praying was that important to Jesus, how much more important should it be to us? Let's GO!

St. John's Church Council met on Monday, May 15, 2023

Turban Project: Turban Project has a worldwide reach making and distributing turbans, hats, beanies and caps. The project is currently looking for a new place and we have agreed to allow the group to tour our building.

Treasurers report: As of May 31st, our total giving was (\$3987.78) less than budgeted but our expenses were (\$6093.95) less than budgeted. We are falling short approximately \$800.00 per month to support the budget. Hope we can continue to keep our expenses below budget to help the shortfall. Approval of report received by Greg Crowthers with a second by Tim Powers. Motion carried.

Pastors Report: Pastor Joyce asked we all commend and hold in prayer the search committee members as they are doing a wonderful job. Pastor Joyce will be attending seminars at NWCC. She will also attend camp at Temple Hills to work with and teach youth participants. See written report for additional information.

Communications: Alarms and suspicious activity at St. John's UCC should be reported to Tom Lawyer. Additional security cameras will be installed mid-June. An invitation to visit Trinity UCC has been received from Ryan Shield. Three (3) council members have accepted and are planning a visit in August.

New Business: Pastor Joyce wanted to gauge interest in Family Fun Fest for the community at St. John's. (This is not instead of Rally Day but in addition to/along with). Food and activities were suggested and given to Pastor Joyce for consideration.

Executive Session was opened to open Foundation Fund meeting.

Foundation Fund was opened and a Foundation Fund in the name of Sandra Donson was approved.

Adjourn: A motion was made by Jeff Conner with a second by Francis Hill to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 7:25 p.m.

Congregational Meeting Re: Boiler Replacement

The results of the June 25th congregational meeting were to replace the boilers and create a Boiler Replacement Fund to generate the additional income needed for the project. Estimated cost of replacing the boilers and adding a backup generator is \$110,000. \$50,000 will come from the Property Maintenance and Improvement Fund, \$19,900 from the Glenda Prescott Estate Fund and the balance to be borrowed from the Mary Martin Estate Fund (to be paid back as money is received into the boiler Replacement Fund).
