Congregational Meeting to Approve Replacing the Boilers

Sunday, June 25



Ongregational The boilers that provide heat to the church have reached the end of their useful life. Some repair parts are no longer available, so before a total breakdown we would like to replace them with two new high efficiency boilers that would also reduce our use of natural gas. We have obtained 3 bids, with the lowest coming from Houston Plumbing. It has been suggested that we also add a backup generator that would power the heating system to maintain heat during any extended power outage. Total cost would be \$110,000. We do have

money available for this project but would need to borrow \$41,000 from a fund that would need to be paid back. We propose to start a boiler replacement fund and ask the congregation to support this fund in order to repay the \$41,000. For any questions regarding the replacement contact Frank Davis. FOSTERING FURTHER RECEIVES AWARD

Licking County's Fostering Further, a nonprofit organization that helps children in foster care, was recently honored by the Ohio Children's Trust Fund for their work in promoting and preserving the well-being of children.

Presented during National Child Abuse Prevention Month, the Everyday Ohio Heroes Award was established under OCTF's Be a Hero in the Eyes of a Child campaign to celebrate individuals and organizations that dedicate their time, efforts, and lives to preventing child abuse and neglect. Fostering Further was one of 8 organizations to receive the award.

Fostering Further, with one of their outreaches located in St. John's Education Facility, is a volunteer, nonprofit organization that ensures child abuse and neglect victims are not forgotten. In 2013, a small group of volunteers consisting of adoptive and foster parents started the "Grant a Wish" program to help secure gifts for foster children that their foster families may not have been able to provide. "Starting Strong" was also formed under Fostering Further to assist old foster children with things like getting their driver's licenses, learning social skill, and more.

We congratulate Valerie Smith and all the volunteers from Fostering Further for their outstanding work and this wonderful recognition.



Search Committee Report May 12, 2023

The committee continues its progress organizing and assisting Pastor Joyce with the Visioning process.

I want to thank those in the Congregation that provided input on this process during the April 23 Visioning Session.

We have concluded one of four Whole Church Visioning Meetings.

A summary of our first meeting will be presented at the May 21 Visioning II meeting.

The committee met on May 10th to review the Congregation's input on the 4/21 visioning session and to review our timeline. We continue reviewing additional mini-survey results.

The committee's timeline is: - Visioning II whole church worship/meeting (including breakfast), on May 21, 9AM-11AM, both services combined. (Who is my neighbor/What are our core values)

The Committee will meet May 24 and review and condense input from the first two visioning sessions and begin assembling the Detailed Survey.

Visioning III whole church worship/meeting (including breakfast), on June 25, 9AM-11AM, both services combined. (Our UCC Heritage and UCC initiatives)

The Committee is to meet, review and condense input from this session and to complete the Detailed Survey by July 7, making it ready to send out to entire congregation. This may take two meetings.

Assemble and send out the Detailed Survey the week of July 10. Request surveys be returned by August 1.

The Committee will meet and review the survey and assemble the overall Profile by August 18.

Targeting Aug 27 for Visioning IV, which is the sharing of detailed survey results and the rough outline of our Church's profile.

Publish final draft of the profile by Sept 15.

I want to thank the committee for their work on this process and their input on all of the items it takes to create a profile for our Church. Getting everyone's input is critical to truly understanding who God is calling us to be and who God will send to us to be our Minister and Leader. I hope everyone will be able to attend the May 21 Visioning II session (and breakfast)!

Church Issues: Lammers Fund rules revision: Elaine Gard addressed the need for changes to rules #6 and #7 of the fund. Motion to change rules #6 and #7 given separately by Francis Hill, both seconded from Jeff Conner. Motions carried.

Boiler Replacement. Bill McInturf stated three estimates have been received for the replacement of the boilers. The planned budget for this replacement is \$100,000. A generator should also be considered for an additional \$10,000. A motion to go before the congregation with a request of \$110,000 was made by Jeff Conner with a second by Greg Crowthers. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: As of April 30, our total giving was (\$2,555.50) less than budgeted. Our expenses were (\$3,902.95) less than budgeted. Treasurer's report was given approval by Robin Green with a second from Greg Crowthers. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Joyce Wealand: To better meet the need, church committees will be asked to assist with visitations. M&O will create hygiene kits to be donated to Church World Service. In Sept., rotations will begin for Thursday evening prayer service.

Communications: The Southeast Newark Civic Association sent a thank you card for the Spring cleanup. Also, a thank you was found in the little pantry stating, "you saved my life."

Search: Visioning Session #2, is on May 21, Session #3 is scheduled for June 25. A survey will be completed and sent July 10th. Aug. 27, results of the survey reviewed, and a profile generated. Profile to go out Sept.15, 2023. Tim is organizing a trip to Trinity UCC. Contact Tim ASAP if you would like to go.

Adjourn: Motion was made by Greg Crowthers, seconded by Jeff Conner. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:42p.m.

Making Disciples as We Go

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples..." Matthew 28:18

Before Jesus ascended, he explained the mission that awaited his followers after he returned to his heavenly Father.

"Go and make disciples," Jesus says. Although this may seem to involve two separate actions—going and making disciples—a better translation of this command is "Make disciples as you go along." It is assumed that Jesus' followers will often be "on the go" and actively doing something. And whether they are far away or close to home, their task is to walk alongside others by teaching them about Jesus and by demonstrating, through the work of the church, what it means to serve him.

"Making disciples" does not mean just bringing others to a one-time "moment of decision." It involves continued learning together, growing together, and increasingly understanding what God has done in sending Jesus to die for our sin and calling us to serve him. All who follow the ascended Jesus share in this task.

Because we serve the Lord of all, we regularly ask ourselves whom God has in mind for us to meet as we go along. We seek to make disciples of our children, our neighbors, our co-workers, our whole world. And when we doubt or struggle in this task, Jesus promises that the authority of heaven will support us in it—always.
