
In the remaining time we have together, we will continue to explore who God is calling St. John's to be, and how God is calling St. John's to serve in this community.

There is an old song by a group called the Medical Mission Sisters and the chorus goes, "God loves a cheerful giver! Give it all you've got." I remember listening to this song as a young child and was always inspired by their enthusiasm. Their upbeat manner of singing, "Give it all you've got" never felt demanding or overbearing. Quite the opposite! It always felt to me like an encouragement to give to the fullest of one's ability while enjoying and relishing the act. To me, that's at the heart of our appeal when we ask for people to give to the church – whether we're asking for a gift of time, talent or treasure.

of time, talent or treasure. 2 Corinthians tells us that we each are to give as we have made up our mind, not regretfully or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. As we enter into new chapters in the life of St. John's UCC, we are in a time when finances are a bit tight. This is not a "red alert", but a reminder that there are ongoing costs associated with the mission and ministry of being the church. We are dependent on the gifts that are shared by you – gifts of your offering money and gifts of your volunteer time. This may be a time when you assess your approach and style to your giving. Do you give intentionally, thinking about the needs of the church as well as your own ability to give? Do you give cheerfully? Do you "Give it all you've got?" The need to prayerfully consider your gifts to the church, not just your financial gifts, but the gifts of your time and talent, doesn't just happen in the Fall during the Faith Promise campaign. The need to think about your giving is an ongoing need. What is God calling you to do in this time in the life of St. John's? What are the new and emerging ways in which your gifts can support the work and mission of the church? So consider your gifts, not regretfully or under compulsion, but as a cheerful giver, giving thanks to God through your contributions to our ongoing call to share our resources and to be the Body of Christ in our world today. "God loves a cheerful giver! Give it all you've got."

Property Management: Greg Crowthers will take on the duty of contact person for the insurance.


Old Business: Boilers are installed and running. A warranty check is required and will be completed on Tuesday, October 17, 2023.




Afternoon Círcle -





Walking Through the Bible

What interests are you passionate about?

Kurt Selles has loved hiking for as long as he can remember. While in high school, he had his first opportunity to hike a short stretch of the Appalachian



Trail, an iconic path stretching 2,190 miles (3,524 km) through the eastern United States from Georgia to Maine. That was decades ago, and he has often dreamed of hiking the entire trail. The busyness of work, family life, and ministry, though, has not allowed for the six months needed to complete such a long trek.

In April 2022, however, he was able to hike the Appalachian Trail for three weeks and while doing so, he reflected on "walking" in the Bible. As the main form of travel in the ancient world, walking is mentioned many times in the Bible. And in that context, walking can mean more than just going from place to place. In the Bible, the Hebrew word for "walk" (halak) can also refer to following God's way as we live for God in his world.

As he hiked along the Appalachian Trail last year, Kurt often felt like he was walking through the Bible as well. Come and join him on this stroll through the Scriptures and on mountain trails, and along the way we'll discover God at work in our own lives too!
