# Area physician uses global experiences to connect to patients locally

DAYTON — Jennifer Lee, DO, MPH, is a family medicine physician with Wright State Physicians (WSP), and an assistant professor of family medicine with Wright State University Boonshoft School of Medicine (BSOM). In addition to family medicine, Lee has a deep interest in and experience with global health. She is one of the main faculty for BSOM's Global Health Scholars Program (GHSP). She credits her global experiences with positively effecting how she cares for patients here at home.

Following residency, Lee devoted two years to completing a global health fellowship at the University of South Carolina and a Master of Public Health in Health Promotion, Education, and Behavior. During this fellowship, she traveled to Nicaragua, where she did research in hypertension and provided patient care. Her work with BSOM's GHSP has allowed her to travel back to Nicaragua and take BSOM students with her.

When asked about the challenges that can come with global healthcare, Lee responded, "Global health takes time, investment, understanding, respect, compassion, humility, creativity and patience." She added how this experience has translated to the way she cares for patients at WSP: "My global health experiences continue to remind me that every person brings their own life story. All people have experienced beautiful joys and deep tragedies, either personally or in their family's history. An individual's life is rooted and enriched by one's background, culture, and community, all of which influence the patient's perspective and health in the biggest ways to the smallest details. For my patients, I strive to join each person on their journey for our time together, and global health enriches me so that I can do that to my fullest ability."

Lee is also trained in Osteopathic Manipulative Therapy (OMT). OMT uses manual manipulation to assess and treat the body for pain or restriction, and restores inherent function or range of motion through treatment. It can help with conditions including tension headache, pain with pregnancy, menstruation, sinus pressure, and back or neck pain. Lee's additional clinical training includes travel medicine, point-of-care ultrasound, and Lifestyle Medicine.

Lee is accepting new patients in family medicine and for OMT. Lee sees patients at the WSP main health center, 725 University Blvd., Fairborn, near the soccer fields on the Wright State University campus. Call 937-245-7200 to schedule an appointment.




Name a famous character who is green. This is just one of the many "Family Feud" style questions we enjoyed at our recent Game Night. In Matthew 18: 20, as Jesus was teaching the gathered people about how to be a community and how to live and function together, he said, "For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." When we are together, in small groups or larger ones, in worship or in meetings or over a meal or around a card table, whenever we gather as a community of faith, we are reminded that we are not alone. Update from your Search Committee

We are in the final stages of preparation in our search process.

- 1. Now that we have completed the self-study (Visioning) and community learning process (Surveys) which identified our church's imagination for the future and corresponding pastoral needs, we are in the process of completing a church profile for potential candidates.
- 2. We will initiate a search process for a new pastor in accordance with our bylaws. Our conference office will advertise our open position to UCC clergy across the country. Our search committee will read ministerial profiles, screen candidates, conduct interviews, check references, and eventually select a candidate who will be recommended to the entire congregation.
- 3. Our goal is for the congregation to elect, in a unified way, a new pastor whose gifts God can use with us and among us for the sake of the Gospel.

The tradition practiced in the United Church of Christ of "calling" a pastor affirms the active presence of God's Spirit in the search process. We will prayerfully seek a pastor with particular gifts and skills while recognizing that candidates are also engaged in a Spirit- led discernment process. We will keep you informed on a regular basis as we move toward God's future as a congregation.

**Search Committee: Committee Chair** Tim Powers provided Council with their own copy of the Ministry Description created by the Search Committee. The quality and accuracy of the document was referenced, and the council thought it an excellent summary of the congregation's goals for a new pastor.

Documentation of the church constitution was also presented in order to clarify the process by which a pastoral interview and hiring process can move forward and meet the requirements and/or recommendations of the constitution and the denomination.

Using data collected in the search for a new Pastor, the Search Committee has worked hard and has done a fantastic pulling together of the survey data in an understandable format. Results are on display in the Fellowship Room and may soon be accessible electronically.

Greg Crowther's thanked the committee for passing along the survey response data to the council so that they can understand what the congregation wants us to know.

#### **Treasurers report**

Based on giving and expenses St. John's is currently in the red at (\$6,795.38). Treasurer's report received approval from Greg Crowthers with a second from Kirk Homrighouse. Motion carried.

#### Personal Outreach Project – April Kinser

April requested permission to use the St. John's name as part of a scholarship for education at C-Tec on Price Rd. in Newark Ohio. The name to be used is St. John's United Church of Christ Cloud of Witnesses Memorial Scholarship Fund. It is her intention to set up (and finance) a scholarship to benefit foster children in the C-TEC system. Further plans are in the works.

A motion was made by Jeff Conner with a second by Frances Hill to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 7:25 p.m.

"As you sent me into the world [Father], I have sent them into the world." — John 17:18

The Bible describes Jesus' followers in a number of ways. We are called forgiven sinners, adopted sons and daughters, and beloved members of the body of Christ. All of these are key aspects of who we are in Christ.

But one of the most important identities we have is as "sent people." Just as Jesus was sent into the world to show God's love, so he now sends us to do the same.

After Jesus' resurrection, his followers received the Holy Spirit to empower them for mission. As Jesus' followers today, we are called to share the good news of Jesus in our words and actions, inviting people to place their faith in Jesus just as we have done.

Too often, local churches become wrapped up in their own concerns. Christians spend so much time running programs and dealing with internal goings-on that they have little energy to build relationships with people outside the church. It's not surprising that many of our churches are shrinking and that a lot of church "growth" is just a result of Christians transferring from one congregation to another. Jesus' teaching makes clear, however, that his followers are partners in God's mission of saving people who are lost in sin. It's not enough to simply talk about sharing our faith—it's part of our identity in being the people God calls us to be.

Father, use my words and actions to help others understand the gospel and see their need for you. Amen.


