Life has a way of catching us off guard. Even when we think we've prepared ourselves.

As many of you know, my mother died on August 12. She had been ill with Rheumatoid Arthritis for over 30 years. The medication she took to relieve her pain and allow her to have some quality of life took a toll on her body. The last few years have been difficult. I miss her and will continue to miss her every day, but I am thankful that for her, there is no more pain. I've known this day was coming, when her body would give out, when she wouldn't be here for me to text or call or visit. I've intentionally spent the last few years making more visits, having the conversations I wanted to be sure we had, sharing that extra cup of coffee together before I ended a visit and returned home. But I still wasn't ready.

It's at moments like this when our deepest understandings of our faith are so important to us. My mother and I talked often about our faith. She was one of the most advanced thinkers I know, and our faith understanding was closely aligned. I know she wasn't afraid to die; in fact, she was ready. I know her relationship with her God was something she held confidently. I find comfort in that. I know that some of her beliefs were ones that others didn't agree with. And I'm ok with that. I know in the depths of my heart that my mother is at peace, and that the love of God surrounds her.

God's grace is grace that is extended to all of us. We don't have to all think alike. We don't have to all believe the same thing. Some of our beliefs may even be in direct opposition to what others believe. Those are our human conversations to navigate. I believe that regardless of what we believe or whether or not we agree, God's grace is grace that is extended to us all. For some people, that is a very comforting thought, for others it's a very challenging thought. But there it is. One of the most important lessons I learned from my mother: God's grace is grace that is extended to every person - past, present, future.

Rest well, Mom. I'll miss our morning coffees together. Thank you living your life showing God's love and grace to all you met.



Bringing People to Jesus By John D. Howe CBN 12-8-22

One of the two which heard John speak, and followed him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first findeth his own brother Simon, and saith unto him, We have found the Messias, which is, being interpreted, the Christ. And he brought him to Jesus (John 1:40-42 a KJV).



Most Christians know who Simon Peter is. Even people who don't claim to be Christians are often familiar enough with the Bible to know that Peter was a prominent apostle out of the twelve (after all, isn't it Peter who is thought to greet people at the pearly gates?). However, a far smaller number would probably know who Andrew was. While Peter may get most of the attention, what if Andrew had failed to bring his brother to the Lord? How different history might have been!

Down through the annals of church history, there are many prominent believers who we still remember to this day. Famous men like George Whitfield, John Wesley, Charles Hadden Spurgeon, Dwight L. Moody, and Billy Graham are just a few examples of people with easily recognizable names. What is less likely known are the individuals who were responsible for these men coming to Christ!

To have a Spurgeon, you must first have a Robert Eaglen to bring him to Jesus. To have a Moody, you must have an Edward Kimball. To have a Billy Graham, you must have a Mordecai Ham (a prominent evangelist in his own right during the Depression Era). It is rare for anyone to come to Christ on their own. God uses men and women to reach other men and women!

Who was it that was instrumental in bringing you to Christ? Who told you that they had found "the Messias" or "the Christ" and brought you to Jesus for the forgiveness of your sins and the salvation of your eternal soul? Whoever that person was, they were taking heed to Proverbs 11:30,

#### "... he that winneth souls is wise."

Every time we share our Christian faith with another person, we have the opportunity to bring them to Jesus. We have the privilege of being an instrument of God to potentially deliver someone out of darkness and into His glorious light, if they believe our testimony.

It's been said that "the only thing you can take out of this life are the souls that you bring to Jesus." The Apostle Paul understood this when he wrote,

"For what is our hope, or joy, or crown of rejoicing? Are not even ye in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ at his coming? For ye are our glory and joy" (1 Thessalonians 2:19-20).

#### **Treasurer's Report – Frank Davis**

Giving was less than budgeted, expenses were less than budgeted. As of July 31, giving was (\$6695.71) less than budgeted and expenses were (\$5611.90) less than budgeted leaving a deficit of (\$1083.81). Also, the November Council meeting needs to be on the 13<sup>th</sup> to approve the budget. The treasurer's report received approval from Tim Powers with a second from Frances Hill. Motion carried.

#### Pastor's Report - Joyce Wealand

Joyce gave a sincere thank you to everyone for their flexibility and understanding during the passing of her mother.

A list of appropriate next steps for the interim pastorate was presented, including but not limited to, vision sessions, membership, personnel policy and procedures, and media which includes screens and monitors in worship, live streaming, the St. John's website, and the Facebook page. No action was taken at this time.

**Communications:** Reports for the Chimes are due Thursday 8/24.

#### Search:

A conversation was held regarding the direction of St. John's U.C.C. as the interim process continues. The theological perspective, congregational preferences and its understanding were also discussed. Greg Crowthers requested that each council member receive a copy of the survey, not just a tally. No opposition was expressed pending determining a process that maintains the survey participant's anonymity.

Tim Powers also announced that the trip up North was canceled due to scheduling conflicts among those that wished to attend.

**Old Business:** Old boilers have been removed and clean-up of the area has finished. The boiler room is now asbestos free. New boilers are to be installed in the first part of September.

**New Business:** Recently, it was discovered that money can be applied for upgrades to energy using equipment. St. John's has applied for these funds. Should they be received, the money will be used to cover or help to cover the cost of boiler installation.

#### **Adjourn**

A motion was made by Jeff Conner with a second by Owen Lee that this meeting of the Church Council be adjourned. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 7:44 p.m.

The next meeting is on Monday, September 18, 2023, at 6:30 p.m. All members of St. John's are always welcome to attend.

The Mission and Outreach Team invites you to help provide Church World Service Period Packs.


During the next 3 weeks, we will collect items needed to assemble Period Packs according to the directions provided by Church World Service. Why are we doing this?




