CONGREGATIONAL MEETING - Please plan to attend the service on Sunday August 4, 2024, at 11:00AM. There will be no 8:00 AM service that day only. The purpose of the meeting is to vote on calling a new minister to St. John's. In addition to hearing our prospective minister preach, we will vote on a temporary suspension of a rule in our constitution and on a budget item to fund our new minister.

It is with great pleasure that the Search Committee of St. John's is recommending that Reverend Dr. Stephen Swisher be called by the congregation of St. John's UCC as our new pastor and teacher.

As required by the Constitution of St. John's, to call a new settled pastor a congregational meeting must be called and a majority vote is required to complete the call. In addition to voting on Pastor Swisher, we will also require a vote for an increase in budget as the current budget only accounts for Pulpit Supply pastors. Lastly, as has been recommended by our UCC Conference Minister, we will ask the Congregation to suspend the section of the Constitution that requires the pastor to have standing in the United Church of Christ. This is a temporary suspension for one year or until Reverend Swisher can work with our denomination and complete the process to become a minister with standing within the UCC. This process can take up to a year.

Reverend Dr. Stephen Swisher has recently been the regional Chaplin for the Careline Health Group and Associate Pastor for the Korean Presbyterian Church of Columbus. Pastor Swisher was a minister in the United Methodist Church (UMC) for 28 years. Recently, Rev Swisher served the Etna, OH UMC. At Etna, Rev Swisher grew that congregation from 40 members to over 400 members. After Etna, he was required to move and serve Epworth UMC, the largest UMC Church in the Toledo area. After starting during a COVID shutdown, he revived the congregation and returned to normalcy. Rev. Swisher was forthcoming about a controversy at Epworth. The search committee has verified that he was without responsibility. We verified this with both Epworth lay leadership (Council) and UMC Conference leadership. Rev Swisher left the UMC last year for multiple reasons, but not being able to choose his ministry and moving frequently were the primary reasons.

Reverend Swisher grew up in a ministerial family with his father being a Methodist minister and his mother a missionary. Reverend Swisher spent time growing up in Japan and Korea and accepted Jesus Christ as his Savior at age 9 and gave his first sermon at that age. Steve has a 13-year-old daughter who lives with her mother in Dallas, TX but she visits Ohio frequently to stay with her dad. Reverend Swisher has both a MDiv and PhD in Government and Religious Studies.

Our ministerial description is what drew Rev. Swisher to St. John's. His beliefs and tenets are an exceptional match to our beliefs as summarized in our recent surveys.

We hope to see you on August 4, 2024.

The Lookup Christian Community Center has a faith based half day learning program for potty trained children aged 3 to 5 years. This fall will be the third year for students. July 15, 2024 Council Meeting



Meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by council President Jeff Connor. Also attending were Council members Tim Powers, Frank Davis, Charles Dudley, Frances Hill, Greg Crothers, Brian Lensink, Gary Kinser, April Kinser, Julie Davis. Also in attendance were Terry Gano, Anita Chirdon, and Kim Workman. Devotions were led by J. Connor who brought a message about how God can change our attitude.

Tim Powers, reporting for the search committee, reported they have found an ordained pastor they would like to bring before the congregation. His application was received through churchstaffing.com and has been a United Methodist minister. A congregational meeting is scheduled for August 4 as required by our constitution to call a settled pastor. There will only be one service that day at 11am. Council voted to approve 3 items with regard to this matter. 1.) To forward to the congregation the need to suspend for one year our constitutional requirement that the pastor have standing in the UCC. During this year he would work to acquire standing in the UCC. 2.) To forward to the congregation for approval a call agreement between the pastor and the congregation which would also involve budget changes since he would be a full-time called pastor. 3.) A letter will be sent to the congregation members outlining details and more information. The candidate is Rev. Dr. Stephen Swisher, who has recently been the regional chaplain for Careline Health Group and Associate Pastor for the Korean Presbyterian Church of Columbus. In the past he has served Methodist churches in Ohio.

Council also approved that Christian Education may sell pizza rolls as a fundraiser for the mission project next year.

Elaine Gard has offered to teach a confirmation class this fall. Council extended a "vote of confidence" for her to move forward with this project. This apparently would include new confirmands or those who would like a refresher.

Greg Crothers indicated that the Evangelism and Outreach committee would like to expand and update our church website to include more information on our ministry and beliefs. Council approved these changes, and they will be found on the church website in the future.





YOU'RE NOT ALONE IN THE WAITING ROOM

"After waiting patiently, Abraham received what was promised." Hebrews 6:15 (NIV)

When you're waiting on God, remember that you're in good company.

Millions of saints before you have sat in God's waiting room. You're not alone! In fact, if you're in the waiting room right now—maybe you're waiting on a job, on an answer, or on a result—there are a lot of people around you who are in that same situation.

Hebrews 11:2 says, "People who lived in the past became famous because of faith" (ICB)—and every one of those people had to wait.

Think about Hannah, who had to wait years to have the baby that she was praying God would give her.

Think about Joseph, who had a God-given vision of being a ruler from a very young age but spent 14 years in a prison for a crime he did not commit.

Think of Moses, who wandered in the wilderness for 40 years while he waited for his next assignment and to know his purpose in life.

Think of Abraham, who waited a hundred years before he had Isaac, the child God had promised him years before.

Think about Noah, who waited 120 years before it rained.

Think of David, who was told he would be king but then was sent back to the pasture to shepherd for years before he ever saw the inside of a palace.


God waited thousands of years before sending the Messiah that had been promised. And he spent 400 years in silence before Jesus was born, with no message for the people who were waiting for deliverance.


